Methods and meaning in weaving with Tim Erickson

October 9, after 7 p.m. All Members Meeting

The Glenview Art League welcomes artist Tim Erickson to demonstrate weaving techniques and share his work on October 9, after the 15 minute All Members Meeting at 7 p.m. in the Glenview Public Library's Community Room East.

Erickson's art practice is a pursuit of understanding his cultural identity through discovery and research of indigenous Bolivian weaving practices, including the traditions, techniques, symbolic and spiritual meanings. His artwork is also influenced by the global waste-pollution crisis. Waste appears as a critical medium in nearly all of his artistry — discarded materials such as clothing, mophead braids, and plastic shipping straps.

GAL artist demonstrations are free and open to the public. This event is ADA accessible. The October demo will be preceded by a short **All Members meeting** where GAL members will vote on the 2024 Board of Directors. A selection of art supplies donated by the family of former GAL president Don Scholz will be available first-come, first serve, free of charge (details on page 3).

Our 69th annual Summer Art Fair on July 22-23 was a big success! We had a gorgeous weekend, fabulous fun, great weather and turnout! We enjoyed every minute!

More than 80 artists exhibited their work, back at the grassy field of Lyon School at Waukegan and Lake, Saturday and Sunday, July 22-23. Juried fine art painting, sculpture, ceramics, woodworking, photography, fiber arts and more were available for sale.

Tom Pope and Lee Colpi served as event co-chairs. Judges William Jamieson and Vesna Jovanovic awarded the following:

Many new artists joined us. Aaron Taber, winner of Best in Show at the 2023 Youth Art Fair, and Zander Brandt, recipient of the 2023 scholarship, exhibited their work. Patrons enjoyed a kids activity table and henna art, ice cream, cookies, and more. Goode & Fresh Pizza provided a special menu and delivery options.

A bench near the school grounds was dedicated in memory of the late Virginia Edwards, 1944-2021. Edwards was president of the Glenview Art League from 1992-1998. She organized the Summer Art Fair for many years.

A Silent Auction raised funds for the GAL's Youth Art Fair. GAL selected to receive B2B Grant

The Glenview Art League has been selected to receive a B2B Arts Grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO). The Back to Business (B2B) grant program provides recovery grants for businesses in the hardest-hit industries, and regonizes the lasting value that organizations like the Glenview Art League bring to communities. Through the state's B2B and Business Interruption Grant (BIG) Programs, DCEO has provided more than \$535 million to more than 15,000 businesses since the start of the pandemic. The amount of the grant will be announced later this year.

Many thanks to **Sandy Sheagren** for her efforts in securing this B2B grant. The funds will support our mission of advancing the study and development of fine art in the community, and serving the needs of area artists.
