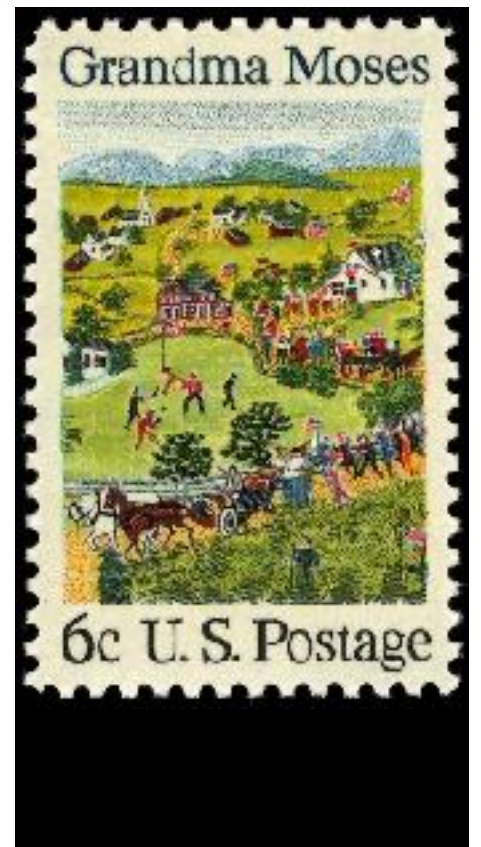
EVENT SERIES: Erin Bingley on the artwork of Grandma Moses

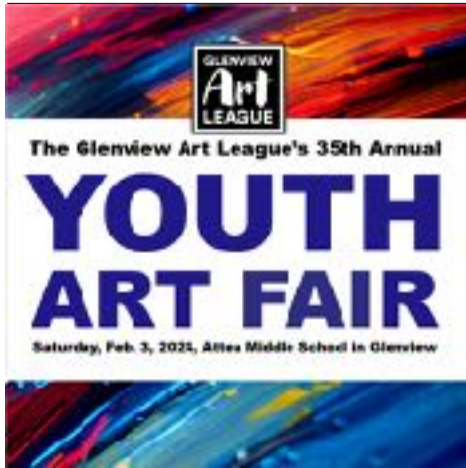
***Wednesday, February 14, 7 p.m. in the

Join us for a presentation on the artwork of Grandma Moses by Erin Bingley, who graduated from Augustana College with a double major in Art History and Geography in 2017 and acquired her Masters in Museum Theory and Practice from the University of Glasgow, Scotland in 2019. Erin has lectured for Generations Oakton Arms in Des Plaines where she is currently the Sales Manager. She is often asked to lecture on a variety of different topics ranging everywhere between the geology and ancient history of Illinois to a full tour of the Louvre Art Museum in Paris, France. Erin has previously worked for the Peabody Essex Museum in Salem, MA, the Wisconsin Historical Society, as well as the Chicago's Museum of Contemporary Art.
